

## January Demonstration

Dan Yost demonstrated his technique for making a lidded box. He started with a block of dry wood glued to a round scrap block held in the chuck. He then shaped the outside of the block into the desired shape using a combination of a bowl gouge and a bedan tool.



Here Dan is tackling the task of hollowing the vessel using an arm brace and a specially shaped square tool bit. This is always the scary part for most wood turners but Dan had several members try their hand at it and some of our experienced members contributed their techniques

One of our guests, Nathan, tried his hand at shaping the outside of the vessel with some guidance from Dan. Nathan gets a free youth membership and is very interested in wood turning.
